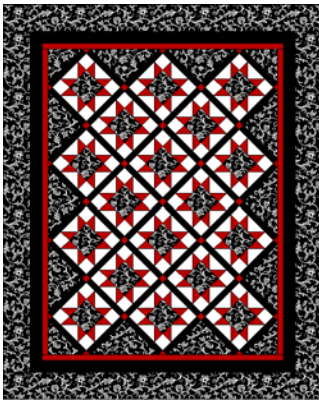
### "The Purse"

This is the pattern that started my designing career and still is my number one seller. I take you through step by step in order to make this purse your very own. It has 6 pockets on the inside and two pockets on the outside. It can be made with or without a zipper. Of the many students that have taken this class very few have made only one.



### "The Beach Tote"

Using pet screen that can be purchased at your local hardware store and a small amount of fabric, you will find how easy it is to make this wonderful tote. The seams are completely finished without having to use binding to cover the rough edges. You will find everyone young and old will enjoy this tote bag.



### "Magical 3-D Stars"

This is a wonderful, fun quilt to make. After making the 3-D star blocks, you will add sashing and assemble your blocks as a straight set. After the quilt center is completed, make two strategic cuts and re-sew the cutoff pieces to the remaining quilt center, resulting magically in a quilt set on-point.



### "Wacky Devine Nine"

Using 9 fat quarters, a couple of borders and before you know it you've got yourself a great quilt. This is a fun and fast quilt using a stack and slash method. So pull some fat quarters and while your at it pull out some fabric for border and you'll be on your way. Finishes approximately 64" x 73".

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### Magical Slice and Dice

This is a wonderful, fun quilt to make. After making four-patch kaleidoscope blocks you will add sashing and assemble your blocks as a straight set. After the quilt center is completed, make two strategic cuts and re-sew the cut-off pieces to the remaining quilt center, resulting magically in a quilt set on-point. Finished size approximately 60" x 85".



### "The Totes"

Make a terrific tote to carry all your "stuff". The large tote is a great size, big enough to carry almost anything. The giant tote will hold an 18" x 24" cutting board along with all your rulers and quilting supplies. Don't let the zipper intimidate you, the instructions make it as simple as can be.



### "Wacky Nine Patch"

Learn how by using a simple "Stack and Slash" method you will make a quilt that appears much more difficult than it really is. It is set off with stars in the borders to complete it.

### Small Projects Include

- Wacky Zipper Bag
- Book Cover
- Sewing Machine Organizer
- Picture Frames
- Wacky Coffee Cup Sleeve
- Shopping Bag

### "Small Wacky Projects"

All or some of these projects can be combined to make a fun day of sewing and completing small projects.
